

Teaching basic number skills to children with Down syndrome and other learning difficulties using the Numicon approach

Wednesday 11th January 2023 9.30 to 12.30pm

Basic number skills are vital to enable everyday social inclusion and independence. The training will commence with an overview of the learning profile of a child with Down syndrome; exploring working memory and how this impacts on learning numbers. It will detail how children learn basic number skills – recognising numbers, saying number names, counting to find 'how many?' and early hands on addition. It will explore the challenges faced by children who have Down syndrome and other learning disabilities and demonstrate how the use of Numicon as a visual representation of number can help to overcome these difficulties and lead to increased understanding and confidence.

COST: £60 per professional (£15 for second person from same school)/£15 per family member.

This session will introduce Down syndrome to people who have little experience of working with children and young people who have Down syndrome. It will cover society's view of Down syndrome, health implications, inclusion, the specific learning profile of people with Down syndrome and strengths and weaknesses in the classroom; outlining ways to ensure your teaching meets their learning needs. Promoting positive behaviour and managing behaviours will also be discussed. Vital training for all involved in the education, inclusion and development of a person with Down syndrome.



Signing and children with Down syndrome

8th & 22nd February 2023, 9.30 to 11.30am

<u>Session 1</u> will cover why we use signing with children with Down syndrome and the signs for manners, animals, food, family and other people, and the alphabet.

<u>Session 2</u> will cover signs for the home, school day, colours, descriptions, time/days, questions and connective/link words. Followed by a discussion on how behaviour can be addressed through introducing signing.

Both sessions will include practice of useful phrases and familiar children's songs. A book "Signing and Down syndrome", covering the signs in this course is available for £7.

Improve your child's sleep Workshop

Teaching number skills beyond 10, time & money

In the morning we will look in detail at tackling number skills beyond 10:

- Rote counting in 10s, 5s, 2s, teens and counting through decades up to 100
- ♦ Recognising 2 and 3 digit numbers, place value and order
- ♦ Counting to find how many beyond 10
- ♦ Adding up and taking away methods to succeed
- ♦ Fractions, multiplication, division and using calculators

Money: We will detail a programme written by Wendy Uttley which consists of 120 finely graded activities to help teach a person with Down syndrome or other learning disability to understand and use money. From the early stages of learning the names for the coins to working with pounds and pence this programme is suitable to use with a child from approximately 5 years of age.

COST: £80 per professional (£20 for a second person from the same school) /£15 per family member.

Reading, Language Intervention for children with Down syndrome

Monday 24th April & 12th May This training course is over 2 half days, 9.30am to 12.30pm.

The RLI programme detailed in a teacher's handbook and DVD developed and produced by Down Syndrome Education International, provides a systematic structured approach via daily activities that can be finely adapted to each child. The training days will cover the theory behind the programme, how to assess a child to find a starting point, how to monitor and record progress and how to deliver the daily intervention with examples from, and reference to, the teacher's handbook and DVD.

The RLI programme comprises of two strands of intervention; a reading strand and a language strand. The aim of the RLI programme is to:

- Improve spoken language and literacy skills of children with Down syndrome.
- Improve teaching practice and support educators.

We have for a long time known reading is a strength for children with Down syndrome but not all educators are aware of this or how to ensure the children reach their full reading potential.

- **COST**: £120 per professional (£40 for second person from same school)/ £30 per family member for both days inclusive.

PLACES LIMITED TO 7 FAMILIES

The course will cover an overview of the learning profile of a child with Down syndrome looking at how difficult behaviours may develop. Parents will then be encouraged to focus on a specific behaviour they wish to modify and we will discuss methods and ideas to modify the behaviour. Support staff working with the child are welcome to come along and be involved in the session in a bid to provide a consistent approach.

Each week opportunities will be offered to discuss progress and learn from each other. Please note that this course is primarily for parents.

Down syndrome & autistic spectrum condition Workshop

Wednesday 17th May, 9.30am to 2.30pm

The workshop will enable participants to share their understanding of how children with a dual diagnosis of Down syndrome and autistic spectrum condition develop speech, language and communication. Using several case studies we will discuss what we know, what we don't know and what we would like to know! There will also be an opportunity to discuss and share ideas on how we manage communication, sensory issues, diet, feeding and unwanted behaviours. COST: £40 per professional(£10 for second member of staff from same school)/£20 per parent, FREE for family members.

It will discuss the different options available for secondary provision and beyond, the pros and cons of each setting, planning the transition and detail the types of courses available for your child/young person.

Discussions on transport, direct payments, personal budgets and supported employment will be included.

Free to family members, otherwise £20.


ME, my body, my friends, my life


How to teach children & young people with Down syndrome about their bodies, keeping safe, privacy, social boundaries and self help skills.

- Safety in the community. Assertiveness. Abuse prevention strategies. How do we become our own protector?


