

WEEKLY ONLINE TRAINING TACKLES BASIC NUMBER SKILLS with WENDY UTTLEY

In December we make a start on **teaching basic number skills to children with Down syndrome** using Numicon as a visual, hands on teaching support. The course will run 10th, 17th December and 7th January (starting a week later than planned).

Basic number skills are vital to enable everyday social inclusion and independence. The training will commence with an overview of the learning profile of a child with Down syndrome; exploring working memory and how this impacts on learning numbers. It will detail how children learn basic number skills – recognising numbers, saying number names, counting to find 'how many?' and early hands on addition. It will explore the challenges faced by children who have Down syndrome and other learning disabilities and demonstrate how the use of Numicon as a visual representation of number can help to overcome these difficulties and lead to increased understanding and confidence.

This will be following in January with the course 'Teaching number skills beyond 10, time and money' on 14th, 21st and 28th January.

Tackling numbers beyond 10 will cover:

- Rote counting in 10s, 5s, 2s, teens and counting through decades up to 100
- Recognising 2 and 3 digit numbers, place value and order
- Counting to find how many beyond 10
- Adding up and taking away methods to success

Time: This workshop will equip participants with a structured programme of activities and resources, developed and written by Wendy Uttley, to help teach the passage of time and then how, step by step, to teach a child how to tell the time.

Money: We will detail a programme written by Wendy Uttley which consists of 120 finely graded activities to help teach a person with Down syndrome or other learning disability to understand and use money. From the early stages of learning the names for the coins to working with pounds and pence this programme is suitable to use with a child from approximately 5 years of age.

Which includes training videos, resources and activities covering all of these basic topics.

WORKSHOP: SEXUALITY RELAITONSHIPS EDUCATION

ME: My body, my friends, my life—5 week online workshop

ME: my body, my friends, my life | Down Syndrome T&SS

Due to demand this workshop has been moved to start 22nd January 2026. It will be delivered over five, 2 hour weekly sessions and, in order to provide consistency, both parents and professionals will be encouraged to attend.

The workshop will provide knowledge and activities to enable parents and school staff to teach children & young people with Down syndrome about their bodies, keeping safe, privacy, puberty, social boundaries,

feelings and self help skills. It will cover:

- How important such training is for young people with learning disabilities. Names for body parts.
- Privacy. Public and private body parts, actions, places, touch and conversations
- Puberty for girls, puberty for boys,
- Feelings, personal hygiene, self help skills.
- Touching, hugging, affection, friendships, appropriate greetings
- Safety in the community. Assertiveness. Abuse prevention strategies. How do we become our own protector?
- Very good for all people working with young people with learning difficulties
- Enjoyed meeting other people and being able to talk openly about issues and facts of life
- It's given me the confidence to talk about the changes my child will
 go through and most of all helped me to prepare and be aware of
 what is to come.
- Understand now the importance of starting this work in primary schools and practical ways of doing this

The cost for this workshop is £100 per team around a child. This means parents, family members and school staff all supporting the same child are invited as part of a team for £100.

OVERVIEW OF ONLINE TRAINING

- ◆ There are 22 sessions in total and these can be booked individually at £5 per session, or as a bundle for £80.
- ♦ The sessions run EVERY WEDNESDAY, 10am to 11am during term time
- ♦ Sessions are recorded so that you don't need to miss any.

All course are divided into several one hour online sessions. Topics covers are

- Introduction to Down syndrome
- Signing and Down syndrome
- Teaching basic number skills to children with Down syndrome and other learning difficulties using the Numicon approach
- Teaching number skills beyond 10, time & money
- Let's make it visual using visual resources to support speech, language, communication and literacy skills
- Reading, Language Intervention for children with Down syndrome

Each topic will be followed with an online consultation for participants. In total 22 sessions spread over the first 2 terms. Sessions will run EVERY WEDNESDAY MORNING 10am to 11am.

In the new year we will be starting a new group for children who are a


little older and, for reasons various, are not currently in school. This will be called the red group and will be delivered by Laura.
