Reading, Language Intervention for children with Down syndrome

Monday 24th April & 12th May 2023.

This training course is over 2 half days, 9.30am to 12.30pm. The RLI programme, developed and produced by Down Syndrome Education International, provides a systematic structured approach via daily activities that can be finely adapted to each child. The training days will cover the theory behind the programme, how to assess a child to find a starting point, how to monitor and record progress and how to deliver the daily intervention with examples from, and reference to, the teacher's handbook and resources.

The RLI programme comprises of two strands of intervention; a reading strand and a language strand. The aim of the RLI programme is to:

- Improve spoken language and literacy skills of children with Down syndrome.
- Improve teaching practice and support educators.

We have for a long time known reading is a strength for children with Down syndrome but not all educators are aware of this or how to ensure the children reach their full reading potential.

COST: £120 per professional (£40 for second person from same school)/ £30 per family member for both days inclusive.

Introduction to Down syndrome FREE

Wednesday 3rd May 2023, 9.30 to 12:00pm

This session will introduce Down syndrome to people who have little experience of working with children and young people who have Down syndrome. It will cover society's view of Down syndrome, health implications, inclusion, the specific learning profile of people with Down syndrome and strengths and weaknesses in the classroom; outlining ways to ensure your teaching meets their learning needs. Promoting positive behaviour and managing behaviours will also be discussed. Vital training for all involved in the education, inclusion and development of a person with Down syndrome.

The workshop will enable participants to share their understanding of how children with a dual diagnosis of Down syndrome and autistic spectrum condition develop speech, language and communication. Using several case studies we will discuss what we know, what we don't know and what we would like to know! There will also be an opportunity to discuss and share ideas on how we manage communication, sensory issues, diet, feeding and unwanted behaviours.

<u>Transition Evening for parents and carers of children</u> <u>with Down syndrome</u>

Monday 22nd May 2023, 7pm to 9pm

This workshop will be aimed at parents of young people with Down syndrome due to transition from primary to secondary school or secondary school onto adulthood.

It will discuss the different options available for secondary provision and beyond, the pros and cons of each setting, planning the transition and detail the types of courses available for your child/young person. Discussions on transport, direct payments, personal budgets and supported employment will be included.

COST: Free to family members, otherwise £20.

ME, my body, my friends, my life

How to teach children & young people with Down syndrome about their bodies, keeping safe, privacy, social boundaries and self help skills

This course is over 2 days Friday 19th & 26th May 2023, 9.30am to 3.30pm


The course will cover:


- How important such training is for young people with learning disabilities. Names for body parts. Privacy.
- Puberty for girls, puberty for boys,
- Feelings, personal hygiene, self help skills.
- Touching, hugging, affection, friendships.
- Safety in the community. Assertiveness.
 Abuse prevention strategies. How do we become our own protector?

The signs for this topic are also covered and available in a book —SRE and Down syndrome cost £6. A Memory stick of resources & activities is available to buy at a cost of £10.

COST: Subsidised fees £60 per professional (£30 for a second professional from the same school)/ **FREE for family members otherwise** £30. Refreshments provided but please bring own lunch.

The club runs every Friday, 6 to 8pm, for young people aged 11 to 13 years and 6pm to 10pm for teenagers and adults up to age 25.





NEW AND YOUNGER BABIES

From 10.45am, on the dates of the Orange Group below, all babies are invited to come along to the centre for some early intervention on tummy time and early babble with Wendy Uttley. There will also be the opportunity to chat about a relevant topic, for example, hearing, feeding, eyesight, benefits, etc, share experiences and finish with some singing and signing to the magic bag along with the infants from the Orange Group.

ORANGE GROUP (Year 1) This is our youngest group for infants aged 12 to 24 months. It will run Monday 17th April and then Wednesday 3rd May and Monday 15th May, 10am to 12pm with Laura Hempel.

YELLOW GROUP (Year 2) This is one of two year 2 groups for children aged 2 to 3 years old. It will run Tuesdays 18th April, 2nd & 16th May, 10am to 12pm with Wendy Uttley.

RED GROUP (Year 2). This is the second year 2 group for children aged 2 to 3 years old. It will run Fridays 21st April & 5th May, 10am to 12pm, with Izzi Ashman.

GREEN GROUP (Year 3) This group is for 3 to 4 year olds and will run Tuesdays 18th April, 2nd and 16th May, 10 am to 12pm, with Laura Hempel.

PURPLE GROUP (Year 4) This group is for 4 to 5 year olds and will run Tuesdays 25th April, 9th & 23rd May 10am to 12pm with Laura Hempel. School staff are encouraged to attend rather than parents if the children have started school.

NEW YEAR 4 GROUP—BROWN GROUP

Due to an increased demand for places our year 4 purple group has been split to form two year 4 groups. The additional group will be called the Brown Group and run on a Monday with Laura. The dates for April and May are 24th April, 22nd May, 10am to 12pm.

TWIRLY21s (break for Easter 1st & 8th April, NO dance)

This is our youngest dance group for children aged 5 to around 12 years of age.

As children leave our early development groups, aged around 5 to 6, parents can often feel the loss of their regular contact and the opportunity to share experiences and offer mutual support. The class meets weekly and while the children are dancing parents can regain this opportunity over a cup of tea/coffee.

Classes are delivered by Claire King who has a wealth of experience of working with young children who have Down syndrome. She has been delivering sessions for us since 2010.

Classes run weekly on a Saturday at Footsteps Theatre School, Idle, BD10 8PY, 2.30 to 3.30pm.

Dancers are asked to pay £2 on entry to practice their money skills.

DANCE21 (break for Easter 6th & 13th April, NO dance)

Our older dance group is for young people aged 12+.

Classes are delivered by Claire King, alongside Kim Booth, one of our most experienced dance21 members.

The sessions run weekly on a Thursday evening 6 to 7pm at Footsteps Theatre School, Idle, BD10 8PY.

The group are working on a number of routines with the aim of performing at external events to promote awareness of Down syndrome and our charity. Dancers are asked to pay £3.50 on entry to practice their money skills.


